All Saints Day Celebration

The early Christian Church marked the anniversary of a martyr's death as their "birthday" as a saint. On All Saints Day we give thanks for the lives of those who have been a blessing and influence on our lives, and who have passed on into the Kingdom of God. This year All Saints Day falls on **Sunday November 1**, and it is an appropriate time to honor and remember those who have died this past year. During the pastoral prayer at the 10:30 worship service that day I will read the names of those who have died (members and family members and friends) in the last year.

If you have a family member or friend whose name you would like included, please contact the church office **before October 28** with the name along with contact information so we can let the family know about his special worship service. There will be a sign-up sheet in the office or you may email or call our church secretary, Linda@fpc.lc or 526-5559. Whenever we repeat the Apostles Creed we say, "(I believe in) the communion of saints." On All Saints Day we are reminded that that we are connected to all the people who have loved God and followed Jesus in all times and all places. Saying the names of those who have died this past year is a way of remembering that we are a community of faith, a family of God.

1st Pres Men: Are you interested in becoming a Turkey Tom this Thanksgiving??


Salt & Light has openings for you to work with children while you become a turkey tom! All you have to do is stand there, and the kids will transform you in a gentle & delicate way!

A Service of Love

What happens when, for reasons of poor health or advancing age, a member of our church family is unable to attend Worship and participate actively in the life of our congregation? Though we may be involved in many things and lead busy lives, we remember Psalm 71:9, "Do not cast me off in the time of old age: do not forsake me when my strength is spent." Yes, the Scripture is clear: it is an essential part of our ministry to assure those we no longer see at Worship of God's gracious love and promises by visiting them, talking with them, sometimes just sitting quietly with them.

In the past, Rev. Marcus Burr and then Rev. Carrol Blevins helped greatly with this ministry, making a real difference to many people. When the Lord took Carrol home so suddenly, Rev. John Himes stepped up, agreeing to fill the need temporarily. He has organized our visitation ministry with regular visits and monthly Communion for those who cannot come to church. Rev. Himes has been extremely generous in giving of his time, making 35 to 40 visits each month, but he will be stepping down at the end of December. The visitation ministry is not optional, but rather a critical need that must be filled. The Session is looking for help to meet this need.

If you know of a retired pastor, even if not Presbyterian, who might be interested, we would like to speak with him or her. We are hoping God will send us someone with a compassionate heart, who could serve the Lord's Supper and work with volunteer lay visitors.

Many of our members do wonderful ministry in visiting the sick and homebound, and they find satisfaction in knowing that they're fulfilling a mission for the Lord. Even beyond that, there is real joy in getting to know the seniors who have truly amazing and interesting life experiences to tell. If you are interested in being trained and committing to serve our homebound, Rev. Norm will be happy to talk with you and provide the support you need.


